

History

1855- History of trading in the valley

1864- Hudson's Bay Company built a post

1885- First Anglican Church service in the present-day stone church.

1874- Treaty Four is signed in Fort Qu'Appelle on September 15th.

1876- NWMP establish a post, and headquarters on the present-day golf course

1876, 1881- Chief Sitting Bull takes refuge in Canada, and come to Fort Qu'Appelle

1884- First Residential School in the west, Qu'Appelle Indian Residential School, in Lebret

1885- General Middleton makes Fort Qu'Appelle headquarters for troops on their way to Batoche.







- Consider an ISSI partnership or writing grants together with a common vision.


